FCC Welcomes the Rev. Dr. James McDonald "Home" to preach Sunday, March 29

We're excited to welcome a special guest preacher at the end of the month who began his journey of faith right here at FCC!

Jim writes: "What makes this day with Flossmoor Community Church special for me is that FCC was where my grandmother, Ninon Walden, was Director of Music, for 19 years from the late 1940s to the late 1960s—my formative years. As a kid, I used to sit in the chancel next to her at the organ console as she played. Names of choir members, especially Ellen Mersh, Betty Crouse, Beryl Sprinkle, still come to mind. Dr. Bell was the senior pastor during that time, and he and his wife, Helen, were formative influences on my life. FCC's Youth Minister in the mid-1960s, Bill Myers, was important for me in my final high schools years. When my grandmother retired, she had 13 choirs, including adult, youth and children's choirs along with several handbell choirs. I loved being a part of FCC."

From 2011 to 2019, Jim served as President of San Francisco Theological Seminary (SFTS) and Professor of Faith and Public Life. In June 2019, SFTS completed a successful merger with the University of Redlands (U of R), creating a new Graduate School of Theology. Following the merger, Jim assumed a new role as Special Assistant to the President of the U of R. Before coming to SFTS, Jim worked for 13 years at Bread for the World, in Washington, DC, where he served as Vice President for Policy and Program, and then Managing Director. Prior to Bread for the World, Jim served as director of the Humphrey Fellowship Program at American University, and taught courses at George Washington University and American University.

Jim is married to Dean McDonald, also a Presbyterian minister. They have three grown children and four (growing) grandchildren.

\$60,690 We face a \$77,252 budget shortfall.

Sundays March 1, 15, 22, 29 @ 11 am / Family Room



As they were all illiterate, their story is narrated by a shunned man who keeps "minutes" of their conversations. This is an original

and fierce manifesto that reveals itself in an irresistible story that it's tempting to read in one sitting.
