OPENING PRAYER (Bob)

APPROVAL OF MINUTES from October 22, 2019 – Approved

TREASURER'S REPORT (Bob) Positive net income this month; income exceeded expenses by about \$14,000. Two highlights – caught up in the month with pledges. Sharing fees for the Community House and the Church have already hit this year's revenue projection. Projecting next month to be strong as well.

PASTOR'S REPORT (Fred)

Fred discussed upcoming changes in personnel and plans, particularly concerning the youth program. Alison Billings' last day will be December 15th. Also continuing to look for a Director for the Praise Team.

NEW BUSINESS

Stewardship (Fred in lieu of Rick)

Update – 117 pledges out of 170; based upon year over year trends, it looks like we will get beyond \$600,000

Pastor Search Committee (Anna in lieu of Chris Dolan)

Update – The Search Committee reports that they have strong candidates, and there are about 12 in the pipeline. Governing Board members discussed the pastoral transition process and Fred discussed current best practices in interim ministry, emphasizing that churches are always “in transition” – staff turnovers, fluctuations in budgets, etc. Fred provided a sheet of “prompts” regarding Long Range Planning for us to come back to at the January meeting. The sheet was called “How Do We Figure Out Our Congregation's Identity?” Governing Board members walked through the prompts to clarify them. Prompts included: Three words that describe our church are..., An important characteristic about our church is..., An important event in the life of our church is..., A time when we were most tested was...; The thing I most appreciate about our church is..., The thing I most appreciate about being a interfaith church is..., Something that's never made sense to me about our church is..., One thing I've always wondered about us is..., Three things we must continue to do are..., Three things we could stop doing are..., Fred encouraged the Governing Board members to go through each of these individually, and then at the January meeting on the 21st do this with the Long Range Planning Committee.

Faith in Action (Kim)

Action: Approve donation recommendations
\$23,600 to 8 organizations:

- Bethel Family Center \$6800 Sponsorship of Job Training Program for youth.
- Jones Memorial Center \$4000 Funding for “When I Grow Up” program for children
- Lighthouse LGBTQ \$1300 \$600 directly to Lighthouse for speaker fees for upcoming programs, \$700 held for FCC sponsorship of Pride Party and tent at event.
- Respond Now \$2000 Purchase of 2 stand up freezers (#1 priority on their wish list)
- Restoration Ministries \$1500 Continue costs associated with ESL program
- Sheilah Doyle Foundation \$2000 Scholarship fund for children to attend camp
- South Suburban Family Shelter\$5000 SSFS has requested funds at combat budget deficit due to decreased funding.
- Preemptive Love \$1000 Emergency Aid, to provide on the ground assistance to people caught in crisis in Northern Syria.

Governing Board voted to approve distribution of the grants to these organizations; Preemptive Love is new, so is Sheila Doyle, the rest are ones we’ve given money to before; we are looking to cultivate more of a relationship by doing more hands on activities – so not just treasure, but time too. Took a voice vote, action was approved.

Adult Education

Highlights:

- Betsy formatted and printed out the Winter/Spring Adult Ed flyer during the first week of the year, so this was available in print and online by the first Sunday of January. This informs members and guests of all opportunities for Adult Education for the months of January through May.

- The Just Mercy Connect event co-planned by the Adult Education Committee and Board of Congregational Connections was a success, with a couple dozen participants going to the movie and gathering at the Groen house after for conversation and snacks. The discussion was led by Kate Saunders, (Board of Congregational Connections member) who teaches the book to high school students, and Isabella VanderWoude, a high school student who has studied the book.
- Pastor Fred has begun his Wednesday evening Bible study on Scripture passages which illustrate the political nature of the scriptures.
- Trina's class on the book Holy Envy is continuing, with continued healthy attendance numbers.
- The individual drop-in classes continue to be a welcome supplement to the multi-week courses, with around 6-12 participants each week.

Hopes:

- We are hoping for continued strong participation in Sunday and Wednesday classes.
- We are anticipating great discussions for the book club book Born a Crime, offered on Martin Luther King Jr Day weekend, as well as through the topics and books which will be studied in February for Black History month. There will be no drop-in classes offered during February to encourage more participants to attend the Black History Month educational courses.

- We were lucky to have 2 weeks off for holiday break

We are also planning for our "Family Fun Event" February 22 upstairs- we have a yoga instructor, Art 4 Soul for hand tiles, and a folk song signer lined up for entertainment.
