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As a family of faith, we have learned in these last challenging eighteen months that we need to be ready to pivot, dig deep, and work together to meet the needs of our congregation and our neighborhood. We have shared our titles with our local Bookie's Bookstore (2015 Ridge Road in Homewood, 708.377.0789) and encourage you to shop local!



Children's Ministries



We've dabbled in it all this past year trying to find the best fit: Outdoor Sunday School (even in the snow), online video lessons and book readings, a Zoom Christmas pageant, socially distanced lunches on the lawn, and our biggest venture yet the return of Vacation Bible School. In July, we joyfully welcomed 60 children to our all-outdoor and fully masked "Compassion Camp". What a sight for sore eyes to see everyone learning and playing together again. Thanks entirely to its volunteers and donors, its success was a perfectly timed reminder that simplicity and flexible creativity will carry us through.

As the new season approaches, we're eager for the return of some consistency, but ever mindful of the safety of our children and teachers in times which remains delicate. Following the success of our VBS model, we feel confident in carrying forward a similar plan for Sunday School, beginning September 12 at 10 a.m. (Check out the Sunday breakdown details on the following page!)

We're excited to share our new curriculum which builds on "Godly Play" ideas and coordinating visual pieces. Children will be led into a deeper dive of the day's Bible story in a way which captivates their minds and leaves them with wonder in their hearts. Stories are paired with intentionally simple coordinating images. This approach encourages learners to process the

story and imagine themselves as a part of God's story, in which we all belong. And of course, like always, we'll have fun! Each Sunday we'll enjoy a creative activity cooresponding with our lesson.

A New Schedule for Fall

Children's Worship @ 10 a.m.

(replaces 11 a.m. Sunday School)

Children will begin worship with their families in the Sanctuary at 10 a.m. Following a time with the children, they will be released to Children's worship at approximately 10:20. Children will remain outside as long as weather permits. Due to the new time and current climate, snack will not be provided, but water will be available.

If you are not comfortable having your children inside the Sanctuary, volunteers will be available at the playground for drop-off while you attend worship. Your children will then join the others as they leave the Sanctuary.



1st Sundays: Communion

On the first Sunday of each month, Children's Worship will conclude in time for children to be ushered back into the Sanctuary to participate in Holy Communion with their families. We ask that you sit on the left side of the Sanctuary (when walking in the doors from the Gathering Space) so that your children can quietly enter and look for you without disrupting the service.

5th Sundays: All-Church Worship

For the 3 months that have a 5th Sunday (October, January, and May), we will have multi-generational All-Church Worship with special content geared toward younger audiences. Our Nursery will be available for children up to 2 years of age for those who are unable to sit through worship.
